# Justification and Sanctification

So, what exactly is justification?

It's when a person is declared or pronounced \_\_\_\_\_ by God (00.22)

It's a \_\_\_\_\_ term that signifies an acquittal – like when a guilty person is acquitted of a charge (00.24)

So, justification then, is the act whereby by God moves a repentant sinner from the state of \_\_\_\_\_ to the state of \_\_\_\_\_ solely on the grounds of Christ's sacrifice on our behalf (01.01)

**We are not justified by what WE DO FOR GOD, we are justified by what GOD HAS DONE FOR US**

“Our redemption is grounded in a double imputation by which our sins are transferred to Christ in the atonement and his righteousness is transferred to us.” (RC Sproul) (01.27)

Rom 4:7 says, “Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered: Blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin.”

Eph 4:8 states it this way, “For grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.”

Justification is that point in time when we have been saved.

- Our sin against God brings death, a separation from God.
- While we were still in our sinful state, unable to save ourselves, Christ died for us.
- His death on the cross was the payment or atonement for our sin.

- Because of the cross we no longer live life separated from God

### How do we live out sanctification?

Eph 4:22-24 identifies 3 key components of sanctification:

“put off the \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_ which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires” (06.30)

“be \_\_\_\_\_ - in the spirit of your mind” (.06.47)

“put on the \_\_\_\_\_ - \_\_\_\_\_, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.” (07.12)

Through the process of sanctification our life is evidenced by fruit of righteous. (07.25)
